VL: How did the idea for your business come about?

Actually, I started from sales of swimwears and already made outfits. Obviously, the level of success in my career gave me the opportunity to wear different brands. And frankly speaking, the different price points will never allow so many beautiful women to experience that feeling. So talking from my experience and my gift of creativity and design, I want ladies to be able to express themselves differently with my clothing line which oozes uniqueness and genuineness, while making it readily affordable for everyone.

VL: How do you build a successful customer base?

It's a tricky one I must say; like all businesses, there were trials and errors coupled with so many failed methods, but thank God for social media platforms which gives you access to a wide variety of people, and for me, online shopping was never my thing. I used my fears and I must say that it helped in having a personal connection with clients, responding to their emails, using live chat on our emails, pop up on a weekly base so they can come in to feel and get to see the face behind the brand.

VL: What was your key driving force for becoming an entrepreneur?

As I think back about my career journey, in retrospect, sports to modelling and my family. I've always wanted to express myself in my own way and I just knew that there were other ladies just like me who are beautiful, elegant, hot and classy to get introduced and to present to them various Pieces of clothing/items that are so unique. And generally, let's just say that the fact that I can walk into any room and find someone else wearing the same outfit, looking so good, brings joy to my heart.

VL: How do you market your business and which tactics have been most successful?

Before I made the decision to start Morey Faith Collection(MFC), I had the privilege to work as brand ambassador for other brands, this working relationship thought me tactics like making video presentations which is so important, instagram live also which enables me to talk to actual clients. Also, I use blog ads and google ads. You know we are lucky to be in this technology age. The most satisfying one is our successful shipping to customers which takes just 23-92 hours no matter their location and difference in time zones. Sometimes, after talking to clients, we engage the services of Uber delivery to deliver bought items and sometimes I get to deliver these items off myself, that's if you are like let's say within 2 hours from my warehouse.

VL: What kind of culture exists in your company and how did you establish it?

I Want my clients to feel good. With MFC, we are focusing on making every woman feel special. Our customer service is top notch, my availablity to talk to my clients, our packaging is personalised and majority of the time, each order has a secret gift from us.

VL: How many hours a day do you work?

Let's just leave it at a lot, because to be a successful entrepreneur in the front end of your business, you need to commit to a lot of hours. In fact, I can't recall the last time I slept for more than 4 hours.

VL: Can you describe/outline your typical day?

Wake up, Say my prayers/ listen to inspirational YouTube videos. Breakfast and talk with my son, Ethan, Drop my son off at school, Work out/Gym, Drop off orders, Start crossing off my to-do list; Make videos for the must haves of the week, Lunch and catch up with family via FaceTime, Meetings with my online team, Pick my son from school, Assist with his Assignments, we catch up and have our own personal time, watch his shows, Shower and Bedtime for my son, Shower, Listen to a book or inspirational videos again. I tend to do this when I'm driving or working alone. Lastly, Write down my to-do list and finish up any work I had.









VL: How has being an entrepreneur affected your family life?

My number one priority is my family. Part of being a successful parent is achieving financial and emotional success. This helps me to be and to play a better role as a mom. I always say "you have to be happy to raise a happy family ".

My number one motivation is my son, I want him to know it is possible to be successful from ground up. Knowing that you can achieve anything you want to, even when the odds do not align.
